## Directions for Picture Book – Five Themes of Geography

The project for our unit on Vietnam will be to make a children's picture book about Vietnam using the five themes of geography. These books will be presented to the first grade classroom as part of our reading buddies service-learning project.

### Guidelines

- 1) The cover must have the title and an illustration representative of Vietnam. Your name and the date must be in the lower right hand corner. The cover should be colorful and attractive. I will laminate this for you and also laminate a back cover.
- 2) Page two will be the author's page. Write one or two paragraphs about yourself. Include your name, age, grade in school, hobbies, and any other interesting facts you would like to include. Include a photo of yourself.
- 3) Page three will be **location**. This will be the map of Vietnam with major cities, bodies of water and landforms labeled and colored. Include two or three sentences explaining the location of Vietnam.
- 4) Pages four and five will be **region**. Choose two of the regions discussed in lesson two; write two or three sentences to describe the region and include an illustration. Do this for each region chosen.
- 5) Page six will be **movement**. Select either goods, people, or ideas and write two or three sentences explaining movement in terms of what you selected. Illustrate your page.
- 6) Page seven will be **human environmental interaction**. Choose an example of human environmental interaction in Vietnam and write two or three sentences explaining the interaction. Illustrate your example.
- 7) Page eight will be **place**. Write three or four sentences about the holiday or celebration you researched. Include an illustration.
- 8) Page nine will be the flag of Vietnam. Draw and color the flag. Write a description of the flag and what the color and design means.
- 9) Put books together in the proper order with the laminated front cover and a laminated back cover and give to me to be bound.
