

## Asian Studies Center at Michigan State University S.C. Lee Best Paper Competitions for Undergraduate and Graduate Students Application 2017 – 2018

The Asian Studies Center at Michigan State University makes awards for undergraduate and graduate students for papers focusing on Asian topics. Students in any academic discipline may submit a research paper (typically 15 – 25 pages with citations) completed for a course or under the supervision of a faculty member, **at MSU during the spring, summer or fall semesters of 2017**. The paper must focus on an Asian topic or have significant content related to Asia. Book reports or literature reviews are not eligible. The paper competition is open to both undergraduate and graduate students who are enrolled through Spring 2018. Only one paper may be submitted by a student for a particular annual competition. Awards will be made during the spring semester.

## **Application Checklist:**

 Signatures: The application must contain the printed name and signature of the professor whose class where the paper was originally submitted. The applicant must also sign and date the application.
 <b>Format:</b> The paper is to be typed, double-spaced, 12 point font, footnotes at bottom, free of spelling and grammatical errors, and any commentary by the professor who graded the original paper. Pages must be numbered; <b>plus a title page without reference to the author's name or class for which it was written must be included</b> . A bibliography is required. Submit paper as a single sided hard copy.
Organization: The paper has a clear statement of purpose and shows clarity of thought with sophistication,
depth, and logic. A clear theme is developed in the paper.
Content: Papers must focus on Asian topics, written for a course at MSU during the spring, summer, and fall
of 2017. The paper shows an objective treatment of the subject matter. Specific terms to a particular discipline are clearly explained.
Course Context: If the paper was written to fulfill a course requirement, a copy or summary of the course
assignment must be attached.
 Competition: The competition is open to both enrolled (including Spring 2017) graduate and undergraduate MSU students. Paper must be completed for a course, or under the supervision of a faculty member at MSU during the spring, summer or fall semesters of 2017.
