

Asian Studies Center at Michigan State University S.C. Lee Scholarship Competition Application 2017 - 2018

The Shao Chang Lee Scholarship Fund was established by friends and colleagues of the late Professor Lee, in his honor, to provide scholarship awards for **undergraduate students** enrolled at MSU who have made outstanding accomplishments in Asian Studies and are pursuing or planning to pursue a program that includes Asian Studies. The primary purpose of these awards is to encourage excellence in scholarship. Professor Lee was a noted authority on Chinese history and religion. He worked tirelessly to promote further understanding between East Asia and the United States.

- Applicants for the scholarship must be undergraduate students enrolled at MSU through spring semester 2018.
- Preference will be given to those who have <u>not</u> won before.
- No student may receive an award two years in succession.
- The scholarship is administered by the Asian Studies Center.
- Selection of the winners is determined by the S.C. Lee Scholarship Committee.
- The scholarships are distributed through the MSU Office of Financial Aid.
- For the academic year 2017 2018, several awards of up to \$5,000 may be given in Spring 2018.

The following documents must be submitted to complete this application:

- An official transcript (physical or electronic copy) of all academic work at MSU is to be sent directly to the Asian Studies
 Center Assistant Director, Julie Hagstrom, or electronically through the Registrar's Office to jhagstro@msu.edu no
 later than February 2, 2018 by 5 p.m.
- 2. **Two confidential references from professors** who are able to comment on the applicant's recent academic performance. These should be delivered directly to the Asian Studies Center Assistant Director, Julie Hagstrom, by campus mail, U.S. mail, or dropped off by the professor *no later than February 2, 2018 by 5 p.m.*
- 3. The application with original signature is to be sent directly to the Asian Studies Center Assistant Director, Julie Hagstrom.
- 4. **An essay of 3 4 pages** (typed, 12-point font, double-spaced):
 - > The essay should be an intellectual autobiography that explains how you became interested in your particular field of international studies, and what plans you have for the future which involve the continuation and development of this interest (e.g., travel and study abroad, language acquisition).
 - It should reveal something of yourself as a person, especially the things you value and the ways these are manifested in your present and prospective international studies.
 - Although this is not a formal academic essay, your ability to express yourself effectively will be a factor considered by the evaluators.
 - **Essay must be sent with application form.**
