Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowships For the Study of Asian Languages and Asia Area Studies Michigan State University

The Asian Studies Center at Michigan State University awards undergraduate and graduate student fellowships under the Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowship program of the U.S. Department of Education for the study of Asian languages and area studies.

Introduction

- The FLAS Fellowship program is designed to meet critical needs for specialists in American education, government, and other services of a public and/or professional nature who will utilize their skills in training others and in developing throughout the United States a wider knowledge and understanding of other countries and cultures
- Funds are available for Summer 2018. Funds for the Academic Year (AY) 2018 2019 for Undergraduate and Graduate fellowships are contingent on receipt of grant funding by the MSU Asian Studies Center from the U.S. Department of Education.
- APPLICATION DEADLINE: February 9, 2018
- Award notifications will be made by March 31, 2018.

General Eligibility Requirements

- This application announcement pertains to students who are or will be enrolled full time in a program that combines Asian language study and international or area studies focused on Asia at Michigan State University or another approved institution.
- This is a competitive award program. Multiple awards are made in each category. Candidates must show potential for high academic achievement based on such indices as grade point average and recommendations. In addition to merit, demonstrated financial need will be taken into consideration.
- Documentation will be required including official transcripts, letters of recommendation and a personal statement.
- Applicants must be U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents.

Summer Fellowships

Undergraduate and Graduate students: Summer 2018 fellowships offer up to \$5000 for tuition plus a stipend up to \$2,500. Summer fellowships are for intensive language learning only. Summer awards may not be used for dissertation research or writing. Courses may be taken in the U.S. or overseas. Summer programs must be equivalent to one full year of language study as provided during the regular academic year.

- Undergraduate and Graduate student language learners must be at the intermediate level or higher in the Asian language proposed to be studied during the fellowship period, if awarded (have obtained 12 credits in an Asian language by the time the fellowship begins).
- > Summer language programs must be a minimum of six weeks and provide a **minimum of 140 contact hours** at the beginner and intermediate levels.
- Programs must be a minimum of 120 contact hours at the advanced level.
- All summer language programs must be offered from an accredited or recognized educational institution and be approved by the Asian Studies Center.
- Reimbursement of up to \$1000 for qualified airfare may be available for overseas program travel. For summer FLAS only.

Funds for the Academic Year (AY) 2018 - 2019 for Undergraduate and Graduate fellowships are contingent on receipt of grant funding by the MSU Asian Studies Center from the U.S. Department of Education.

Undergraduate students: AY fellowships for undergraduate students offer tuition payments of up to \$10,000 per academic year and a monthly stipend up to a total of \$5,000 for the same period. The academic year includes fall 2018 and spring 2019 semesters. Students must enroll for full time academic study at MSU, or another approved site, and pursue a course of study that includes both language training and Asian studies course work during the year in which they hold the fellowship. <u>Undergraduate language learners must be at the intermediate level or higher in the Asian language proposed to be studied during the fellowship period, if awarded (have obtained 12 credits in an Asian language by the time the fellowship begins).</u>

Graduate students: AY fellowships for graduate students offer tuition payments of up to \$18,000 per academic year and a monthly stipend up to a total of \$15,000 for the same period. The academic year includes fall 2018 and spring 2019 semesters. Students must enroll for full time academic study at MSU, or another approved site, and pursue a course of study that includes both language training and Asian Studies course work during the year in which they hold the fellowship. Graduate student language learners must be at the intermediate level or higher in the Asian language proposed to be studied during the fellowship period, if awarded (have obtained 12 credits in an Asian language by the time the fellowship begins). Ph.D. candidates who have completed their course work must be at an intermediate or advanced level in an Asian Language. They also have some specific requirements regarding applications requesting support for dissertation research and writing.

1. Summer 2018 Fellowship Applicants:

- Summer Fellowships may be used for intensive language study *only*. Summer awards may not be used for dissertation research or writing. Courses must provide a minimum of 140 contact hours at the intermediate levels, or 120 contact hours at the advanced level. Summer language programs must be equivalent to one full year of language study as provided during the regular academic year. In addition, the language training must take place over a minimum of six weeks.
- > All courses must be offered from an accredited or recognized educational institution.

F. Plan of Study continued

- If the applicant plans to enroll for language study at an institution outside the U.S., a letter must accompany the application providing a rationale and benefits to be obtained from study outside the U.S.
- Final approval of overseas language programs is contingent on consent from the Title VI program officer in Washington, D.C., obtained through the Asian Studies Center office before FLAS award is made.
- > All material submitted in a language other than English must be provided with a translation.
- Summer Fellowships are available for undergraduate and graduate students. Both undergraduate and graduate students must be at the intermediate/advanced language level when entering the summer program In the table below, list one or more proposed sites for summer intensive language study.
- A brochure or other documentation from each proposed program showing that it meets the criteria above must be attached to the application. In addition, provide a link to the program's website in the table below.
- It is critically important that information about tuition and fees be provided if possible. While this information is often not always available at the time of your application, use the most recent information available and update the Asian Studies Center at a later date.
- ➤ Brochure information from the previous year may be appended to provide estimated costs in the meantime. Printed copy from a website is acceptable as is providing a copy of e-mail communication.
- > Failure to provide this information may result in your application being sidelined or denied. Applicants are also encouraged to apply for acceptance into summer language study programs (especially those outside of the U.S.) in advance of FLAS award notifications as necessary. It is the applicant's responsibility to apply for summer programs and for requisite visas and other materials.
