The mission of the MSU India Council is to promote educational and cultural activities related to India. The MSU India Council was established on August 7, 1989 as an endowment at the University. Its objective is to work with the Asian Studies Center within the International Studies Program at Michigan State University, as well as independently to:

- Stimulate interest in India and matters related to India among the people in Michigan;
- Promote educational and cultural activities related to India;
- Assist organizations at Michigan State University and elsewhere in promoting activities that are aligned with the mission of the India Council;
- Promote outreach and exchange programs with organizations interested in socio-economic, educational, cultural and artistic aspects of Indian culture;
- Undertake activities to increase the India Council Endowment Fund and establish such other funds as may be deemed necessary to promote the mission of the India Council.

Profile of Awardee



Dr. Anil Jain

University Distinguished Professor and Douglas E. Zongker Endowed Professor

Anil Jain, a University Distinguished Professor and Douglas E. Zongker Endowed Professor at Michigan State University where he has taught and conducted research since 1974. He received his B.S. from the Indian Institute of Technology, Kanpur (1969) and M.S. (1970) and Ph.D. (1973) degrees from The Ohio State University, all in Electrical Engineering. For his many advances in pattern recognition and biometrics, Dr. Jain was inducted into the United States National Academy of Engineering, Indian National Academy of Engineering, The World Academy of Sciences, Chinese Academy of Sciences and National Academy of Inventors. Dr. Jain received the Guggenheim, Humboldt and Fulbright fellowships along with the King-Sun Fu Prize. He was appointed to the United States Defense Science Board, NIST Forensic Science Standards Board, and AAAS Latent Fingerprint Study. He has authored *Introduction to Biometrics*, *Handbook of Face Recognition*, *Handbook of Fingerprint Recognition and Algorithms for Clustering Data* which are standard references in biometrics and pattern recognition. For his plethora of discoveries, impact (h-index of 220 and cited by 277,000) and applications in biometrics, his service to the research community, and his extensive mentorship, Dr. Jain was awarded Doctor Honoris Causa by Universidad Autónoma de Madrid, Hong Kong University of Science and Technology and Hong Kong Baptist University. The BBVA Foundation granted its 17th Frontiers of Knowledge Award in Information and Communication Technologies to Anil Jain and Michael Jordan of University of California, Berkeley for their "core contributions" to machine learning, which have unlocked developments in biometrics and artificial intelligence.
