Title: Africa		
Standard: 3 – P4.2.2 Participate in projects to help or inform others.		
Materials: Pencils, sticky notes, <u>Africa, Amazing Africa</u> by Atinuke		
Pre-assessment: Ask students what they know about Africa. Pass out sticky notes to each table and have students write a fact they think they know about Africa and have them stick it to the board. They can write as many notes as they can.		
Read <u>Africa</u> , <u>Amazing Africa</u> by Atinuke to the students. (page 47) Discuss ideas that support or contradict their facts from the sticky notes.		
Watch a video clip on the Liberian handshake. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=rVtfN1bzUsM		
Divide students into groups to create their own handshake. Discuss how this makes them feel to have their own special handshake.		
Show a video clip of the Burundi Drummers. (page 57) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=iecVcVsmrnY		
Students complete a Venn diagram comparing and contrasting this music to the music they listen to.		
Show videos on DRC, Ethiopia, South Africa, Nigeria, Egypt, and Kenya from Globetrottinkids.com website.		
Ask students: "What new information did you learn?" "How did your thinking change about Africa and the people?"		
Post-assessment: Write facts about Africa on sticky notes and put them on the board.		

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Title: Africa		
Standard: 3 – P4.2.2 Participate in projects to help or inform others.		
Materials: Africa, Amazing Africa by Atinuke		
Pre-assessment: Ask students: "What does the word "fair" mean? Get ideas from the students and discuss. Students need to understand that fair does not mean equal.		
Read Africa, Amazing Africa by Atinuke to the students. (page 58)		
Ask students: "Does anyone know what "fair trade" means? Discuss this to check students' understanding. Have they seen these words before? If so, where?		
Have students research what fair trade is and how it works.		
After research is completed, discuss with students how they can make others aware of "fair trade" products.		
Post-assessment: Write facts about Africa on sticky notes and put them on		

the board.
